**From the Principal's Desk:**

This summer when your child is bored, please have a selection of books on hand for them to read and/or a good book to read aloud. The children are of an age that an on-going read aloud chapter books make wonderful memories. In a past bulletin I sent home a book list and mentioned the library programs that will help reinforce reading over the summer.

Math can be fun. There are so many games that are math based. I will be sending home with students in K-5 a zip-lock baggie with a deck of cards, a pair of dice, and instructions for different math games. I hope you will take the time to play these games with your child. Not only are they reinforcement of math skills, they give you and your child a chance to be together. Laugh a little, talk, teach and help your child have a positive feeling toward math.

Don't forget about math relays. You will need a set of flash cards and a set running distance. You may have the child or children make one or two lines. Present the math problem. If the child answers the problem correctly he/she then runs the distance and back. The child who gets back first wins. If only one child is running the relay, they may run against the clock. Children love to see if they can beat the clock. (Hint: children love stop watches.)

There is math in almost everything we do. For example:

- \* How many steps are from here to the door? This question helps a kid-o use one to one counting skills.
- \* Here is a handful of coins. If you can count it correctly, you can use the money to buy your own lunch at McDonalds. If you don't count it correctly you will have peanut butter and jelly for lunch.
- \* How many more minutes are there until we leave for church?
- \* If your cup of milk is an 8 oz. cup, how many ounces will you drink if you have two cups?

Try to challenge you child's mind daily with puzzles, patterns, questions and problem solving. Math can be fun! I hope the math games that I will be sending home the last week of school will help you keep your child's mind active.
