# Happy Feast Day of the Epiphany

An epiphany is an insight or revelation. We understand something in a new way, and something clicks in our mind. On this day the Church enters the event when Jesus was revealed to the nations. The shepherds were the first to bear witness to the birth of the newborn King. The Magi represent all the other nations, the Gentiles, that come and encounter Jesus. It is a fulfillment of the prophecy in the first reading. Isaiah foresees a time when nations will come to Israel and be transformed. The light that shines from Israel will provide light for all other nations. The Magi come from the far east, probably from the area around Persia. They were astronomers and were already watching the night sky. The star must have been miraculous to get their attention and lead them all the way to Bethlehem from Persia. Iran is the modern-day country where Persia would have been. The Magi were touched from their encounter with Jesus and returned to their native place by a different road. They were somehow changed from meeting Jesus.

I was blessed to spend some time in Israel during my seminary education. We were in the Holy Land for twenty-five days. We visited Bethlehem and prayed at the church of the Nativity. It is one of the oldest Christian churches in Israel and is the only one that was never destroyed throughout the Crusades and other conflicts. Above the front doors is an image of the Epiphany that details the visit of the Magi. The church was spared from destruction when all the other churches were leveled because the invading army recognized that their own nation was depicted. The Epiphany continues to be a bridge between nations.

### School Mass Schedule

I wanted to take a second to address the changes to the school mass schedule. First, beginning this week, Wednesday January 10, we will have school mass every week. That will be the norm going forward. Last semester and throughout the fall

season we slowly introduced the practice of participating in mass as a school community. We roughly had them the first and third Wednesdays of each month. The other weeks I would visit the different grades in their classrooms and talk about a variety of questions. The older grades had a teaching mass where I spent extra time explaining the history and meaning of the ritual and practices. I enjoyed the different experiences with the students. However, this schedule was to prepare the students and parish community for weekly mass in 2024. The liturgy is open to all students, families, parishioners, and anyone that wants to come.

Why make it every week? Maybe you are having that thought while reading this article. I believe this change is important because the mass is a central aspect of our Catholic identity. The mass is the highest and most sublime public prayer of the Church. The mass is where we experience community rooted in God's Word and receive Jesus in the Eucharist. The mass is not an add-on or throwaway aspect of our Catholic heritage. I want to communicate its importance by making time for its celebration in the weekly schedule of the students. I also think it is important to instill and develop the habit for everyone, regardless of age, of fully participating and preparing for mass and an encounter with God. This means preparing in the classroom during the week. For example, I will be talking about the readings in the classroom prior to weekly mass. I encourage parents and other family members to discuss and learn about the mass and its rituals together as a family during the week. It is up to us to prepare for the mystery. The job of the liturgy is not to simply entertain like an amusement park, but to transform our interior self. I thank you for your support and assistance by communicating to old and young alike the importance of mass and liturgy. I look forward to celebrating God's love with everyone.

### Fun Fact

As I was growing up my parents would move the Magi around the house until Epiphany. Then they would finally arrive at the manger and greet Jesus.
