What gestures did you see at Mass? Are there words that accompany any of those gestures? Are there gestures from church that we can do as a family at home?

## Reflecting on the Word:



As followers of Jesus, we are a part of a community. No one is a disciple of Jesus by themselves. In today's Gospel, Jesus calls two siblings, Andrew, and Peter, to be his disciples. Jesus knew how important it is to have family. We all

need a community for support and encouragement, and a community to celebrate with and to share our encounters with the Lord. Fortunately, we have a built-in community in our family members! How eager are we to share what we have found with our family members?

## **Living the Word:**

Our family is the domestic Church, or the Church of the home. We encourage holy habits in the life of our family and perform rituals that help us to follow Jesus. It is important that our children hear the words of the prayers of their parents and vice versa. Invite family members to write a prayer thanking God for your Church of the home and for your parish church. Read your prayers aloud and place them on your prayer table where they can be reread during the week.

## Father Marc's Minutes...

## Back to Ordinary Time



We now enter back into ordinary time for several weeks. This past Monday was the celebration of the baptism of Jesus. We jump many years from Epiphany to the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus has grown

up and been formed at the hidden school of Nazareth for thirty years. He has been trained how to pray and discern the Father's voice. All the time spent at home was preparing him for his public ministry. Just as Jesus learned and spiritually developed during this ordered and hidden time, the church invites us to do the same thing in our own lives. Ordinary time is not some throw away and unimportant time of year. There may not be a specific theme present during ordinary time like there is during Advent or Easter. However, ordinary time invited us into ordered time. We live ordered time by organizing our days to grow spiritually and be astute observers of how we spend our time. What priorities do we have, and do any of those need to be shifted or replaced?

I want to briefly reflect with you on the event of Jesus' baptism. It is a shame that we were not able to celebrate it on a Sunday this year. The feast day is a beautiful time to reflect on the gift of Baptism and assess our life to see how well we have been living out our own baptismal promises. The baptism of Jesus also provides us with time to reflect on the incredible dignity we have that comes from being a child of God. When Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan River the Holy Spirit descends and remains with Jesus. The Holy Spirit does not leave him as he accepts the mission the Father gave him. The Father audibly affirms the identity of Jesus as the Beloved Son and encourages the witnesses to pay attention to him. The Father says, "this is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." I encourage everyone to reflect on Jesus' baptism so that we remember our own identity as a child of God.

First Eucharist will be celebrated during weekend liturgies after Easter in the month of April. 
