Family Talk Time: <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u>


What does it mean to be holy? How are each of us made holy? Our home is a holy place. How is that made visible? Why do you think the people listened to Jesus when he talked? Why do you listen to Jesus?

Reflecting on the Word:

The unclean spirit recognizes Jesus and proclaims his identity, "I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Yet the people who encounter Jesus in the synagogue are amazed by his teaching and ask one another, "What is this?" How often are we amazed by our encounters with our Lord? Do we always recognize his powerful actions in our day-to-day life?

Living the Word:

In our creed, we profess that we are one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. The word *holy* means to be set apart for a special purpose by and for God. Discuss as a family who you know who has been set apart for God's work. (Hint: it is all of us!) Invite each family member to consider how God is calling him or her to holiness this week.

Father Marc's Minutes...

Jesus speaks with Authority



Moses speaks to the Israelites in the first reading and makes a promise from the Lord. The Lord promises to raise up a prophet like Moses. Moses was this larger-than-life figure for

the Israelites. He was the person chosen by the Lord to lead this nation out of slavery in Egypt and into the promised land. Moses was the chosen messenger of the Lord for the people and communicated to them the desires and commandments of the Lord. When Moses spoke, the people listened. The Lord expects the people to listen to the prophet because the prophet is speaking on behalf of the Lord. God also makes a warning to potential false prophets. If someone is presuming to speak in the name of the Lord, that person had better make sure it is an authentic word. God is not a fan of false prophets.

Now we come to Jesus in the gospel. Jesus enters a synagogue and teaches on the Sabbath. Jesus teaches with authority and not as other pharisees or scribes. Other rabbis would reference their teachers to establish credibility. However, Jesus refrains from this practice. Jesus' authority comes from the Father and not from another human teacher. The crowd perceives this and stands in awe of his innate authority. Even unclean spirits and demons recognize the power and authority of Jesus. Jesus is the Prophet that is promised in Deuteronomy chapters 18 and 19.



This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentines Day. I encourage everyone to use this as an opportunity to evangelize. On Valentines Day we celebrate and recognize people and friends that are dear to us. Ash Wednesday fits right into this theme. On this day we recognize our need for repentance so that we can adequately embrace and reflect the heart of our Beloved. We do not feast on chocolate this day, but present to our lover, God, a contrite and repentant heart. The ashes on our foreheads are another external sign of our commitment to the Lord. Let's make this Lent truly life changing so that the ashes we receive are not an empty sign. Our mass times for that day are 9 am and 7 pm.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are two days of fasting and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. Over the next few weeks, I will dive more into the disciplines of Lent and ways that we can prepare for this wonderful season.

- Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older who have not celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (like water, juice, milk) are allowed. Pop and alcohol are not allowed.
- Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- The Church gives us three disciplines to particularly focus on during Lent. The disciples are fasting, praying and almsgiving.
