### Father Marc's Minutes...

## Happy Feast of Candlemas (Presentation of the Lord)

On Friday we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, or otherwise known as Candlemas. The second chapter of Luke highlights this event during the infancy of Jesus. Forty days after Jesus' birth he was brought to the temple for the rites of purification and dedication. Jesus would have been circumcised on the eighth day after his birth. Mary, as all Jewish mothers, would stay at home for just over a month to observe the purification rites after childbirth. This rite of purification also included the offering of a sacrifice, either a lamb or some birds. A first-born son also needed to be "redeemed." It was a type of payment for this Passover sacrifice which is a callback to the book of Exodus. Luke makes the focus of this event Jesus' presentation and consecration to God. The verb "to present" also means "to offer." Luke is reminding the reader that Jesus is the priest who offers the sacrifice and is himself the sacrifice being offered. This feast is a proclamation of the light of Christ to all nations.

The blessing of candles to celebrate the light of Christ is one way the Church has celebrated this feast day since the seventh century. The candles remind us of our own baptism where we received the light of Christ and the charge to keep the light burning bright. We bear witness to the light in our lives. Traditionally candles that will be used throughout the year in church or in our homes are blessed on this day. Hence, the feast day has coined the term "Candlemas." One interesting note is that Groundhog Day stems from this celebration. With the strong influx of Protestants into America, they replaced Candlemas with Groundhog Day.
