

We pray a prayer at Mass called the Gloria. Be sure to listen to the words: "We praise you,/we bless you,/we adore you,/we glorify you." What do you imagine the glory of the Lord looks like? How can we give God glory? What would that look like?

### Reflecting on the Word:



In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John witness the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. Moses and Elijah appear on either side of Jesus, showing us that the Law and the Prophets direct people to m the full globu of Cod is manifest. The

Jesus, in whom the full glory of God is manifest. The three disciples did not experience this as individuals, but as a group, in community. The family is a community in which we can experience the glory of God. How have we experienced this in the sacraments, in the beauty and wonder of nature, or in our life as the domestic Church?

### Living the Word:

Make a prayer card for your family prayer table, or as a centerpiece on your dining room table, that reads **Glory to God.** Pray the Gloria prayer from Mass or the Glory Be prayer each night this week. Discuss when and where you have experienced the glory of God.

# What is the Mass about?



Why do you come to church during the week or on the weekends? There are many other things to do on a Sunday or Saturday evening. Church services tend

to be very similar from week to week. So often in life we approach situations by asking the question, "what are we going to get out of this?" Whether we engage in activities oftentimes depends on an affirmative answer to that question. This is the wrong question to be asking about prayer and participating in the Mass. Now we certainly receive blessings from the liturgy. We receive community with one another, a reflection on God's word, and the amazing gift of the Eucharist (just to name a few). God is certainly generous with blessings. However, I encourage all of us to enter the liturgy with the question, "what can I give?" When we are baptized, we are called to be holy. Holy means to be set apart for a particular and sacred function. At baptism we share in the three-fold office of Jesus as priest, prophet, and king. The role of priest allows us to offer sacrifice to God for the salvation of the world. The role of prophet lets us hear and speak the words of God. The role of king allows us to order our life based on Jesus' lordship and provide for and serve those in our care. The Mass is a special contact point for us to offer our week to the Lord as sacrifice, hear the words of God so that we may proclaim them, and be interiorly transformed to rule and govern our station according to the Lord's directions. Shifting our perspective on the liturgy can put the love story back into our faith and move us from a to-do list concerning prayer and Sunday liturgy into a life-giving relationship.

Over the next few weeks, I want to talk about liturgy. My hope is to break down its parts to shed light and understanding. The first quarter of the Mass is called the Introductory Rites. These rites consist of the entrance chant/song and ends with the collect. The entrance procession is meant to remind us of a royal procession. We enter and begin this time of prayer by processing into the throne room of God. The crucifix leads the way because we follow the cross of Christ to victory. The altar servers follow and then, if applicable, the Book of the Gospels. Finally, the priest presider comes as the symbol of Christ during the time of liturgical prayer. After this we have a penitential rite where we remember our sins so that we have a humble heart to receive God's graces over the rest of Mass. The point of this is not to shame us but to have us approach the Lord with an accurate memory of who we are and our need for the Lord. This moves us to greater thankfulness for the extreme generosity and mercy of God. After the Penitential Act we praise the Lord for God's mercy with the Gloria. Then the Collect prayer happens. The words "let us pray" are meant to gather our personal prayers together into one communal prayer. The priest takes our personal prayer and offers it with the words of the collect.
