**Family Talk Time:** <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u> By Sara McGinnis Lee

How does it feel to be alone in a dark room? How does it feel when the light is turned on? Jesus said, "I am the light." Imagine his light all over the world. At Mass, servers often carry lit candles to the ambo and hold them while the Gospel is read. The candles remind us that Jesus is the light of the world.

## Reflecting on the Word:

Jesus tells Nicodemus that he is the light that has come into the world. Some days it seems like the darkness is going to overtake the light, but we know that the light is stronger than darkness, that his love is stronger than hate, and that his risen life is stronger than death. Children are often afraid of the dark and know that great comfort is found in the light. God made us to live in and walk in the light.

## Living the Word:

Count the lights you have in your home: lamps, lightbulbs, flashlights, nightlights, porch light, candles, lanterns, and so on. What would your home be like if you could not use the gift of light? Just as we need light in our homes, we need the light of Christ to enlighten us. Pray together that the light of Christ would shine more brightly in your home and in your life this week.

## Father Marc's Minutes...

## Delving into the Mass part 3

We continue our discussion of the Mass. The first article broke down the Introductory Rites from the opening chant or hymn through the collect. The second article discussed the Liturgy of the Word with the readings, psalm, homily, and general intercessions. I want to continue our discussion by delving into the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the Eucharistic prayer. We begin with the offertory and preparation of our gifts. The bread and wine are brought forward with the monetary offering. This represents the gift of our labor, and through it we are invited to offer our very selves. The priest then raises the bread and wine and gives thanks to the Lord for these gifts. The action comes from the Jewish practice of the berakah, or blessing. The Eucharistic prayer is centered around the Passover meal that Jesus celebrated with the Apostles. The Eucharistic prayer is the beautiful prayer which begins with the preface "the Lord be with you...lift up your hearts." The preface of the Eucharistic prayer is like the foreword page for a book. It gives an idea of the story and sets the stage in broad strokes. The preface does the same thing for the Eucharistic prayer.

The overall structure of the prayer consists in four segments. First, we adore and praise God. The first movement of prayer is to adore and praise God just because of who God is. Secondly, we thank God for His blessings. Third, we remember and enter back into the events through which God has saved us. Memory is not just a fond recollection, but a re-entering and making events present to us. Fourth, we petition and make supplication to God for our needs and the needs of the world. These parts provide us with a useful structure for our personal prayer as well. I encourage everyone to utilize this for themselves: adore/praise, thankfulness, remember God's activity in history and your life, and ask God for your needs.

When the priest holds up the consecrated wine and bread it symbolizes the death of Christ due to the separation of the Body and Blood. The assembly responds with a resounding "Amen" which means "I

believe." We sing the praises of God and with joy state our joy and belief in the power of Jesus Christ. After the Eucharistic prayer we pray the family prayer of the Our Father. One of the petitions we make in the Our Father is to give us this day our daily bread, but it means "supernatural bread." We praise God and continue to petition the Lord for the Eucharist each time we pray this magnificent prayer. After this prayer we begin the preparation for communion. The phrase "the Lord be with you" marks important times throughout the liturgy. It reminds us to listen up and notice what is going on. The offering of peace is not merely an empty ritual. Instead, it is meant to illustrate a central point that we are in communion and at peace with others before we receive the Eucharistic Lord into our hearts. Then we pray the "Lamb of God" and echo the words of St. John the Baptist when he announced Jesus. We confess our faith once again that Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. I could keep going but we will pick up this discussion next week.

- We continue to have soup suppers and the Eucharist study on Wednesday evenings. On March 20th there is a reconciliation service at 7pm instead of the study. The Eucharist study will continue April 10th, 17th, 24th at 6:30pm
- There is a diocesan listening session on March 19th at 6pm in the social hall
- The youth group will lead us in prayer with the shadow stations of the cross at 7pm on March 15th


## Thank you to all who donated to the Food Pantry!
