#### **Family Talk Time:** <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u> By Sara McGinnis Lee

In today's Gospel, the people lay their cloaks on the road in front of Jesus as he enters Jerusalem. Others lay palm branches on the ground. This is one way that the people honor Jesus. How will we honor him today? How can we praise him this week?

## **Reflecting on the Word:**



The people praise Jesus today, and we will echo the words the people shout as Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem: "Hosanna!" Hosanna is a word found in the book of Psalms and a cry for help. It means, "Save us, we

pray!" We have all experienced challenges in parenthood, whether at the birth of a child, during toddlerhood, or school age. We sometimes feel alone in our struggles, not realizing that God is present in all those moments of difficulty, ready to listen to our cries, and respond to our prayers.

### Living the Word:

Write a prayer of praise to Jesus or decorate a prayer card with the word Hosanna. Imagine Jesus is coming to your hometown today, riding on a colt. Discuss how your family would greet Jesus.

# Father Marc's Minutes...

# Palm Sunday and Holy Week

Today we celebrate the holy event of Jesus entering the city of Jerusalem in preparation for his passion and death. This event is recounted in Matthew 21. Mark 11. Luke 19. and John 12. The inhabitants are excited to witness this historic occasion. This was a prophecy and sign of the Messiah. The Messiah was going to come into Jerusalem riding on a colt in a humble manner. The citizens took palm branches out and were singing "Hosanna" and "Blessed is he who comes in God's name". Jesus fulfilled the prophecy of Zechariah 9:9 and Isaiah 62:11 when he entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The passage from the prophet Zechariah reads "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt the foal of a donkey." This is why Jesus told his disciples to fetch a donkey for him. He had just performed mighty signs and worked marvelous wonders and so people were expecting him to step into the role of the military Messiah who would deliver Israel from their oppressors. Jesus indeed is the Messiah, but not in the way they were anticipating. This week we are invited to reflect on the mystery of Christ's passion and death with the celebration of Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum. These holy days are the most solemn days of the entire year. Holy Thursday celebrates the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist. Good Friday remembers and celebrates Christ's sacrifice to overcome sin and his death. Holy Saturday calls to mind the time Jesus spent in the tomb. At the Easter Vigil catechumens are baptized and received into the Church and the Church reflects on God's word and how he acted throughout history to save us. Then on Easter Sunday Jesus is raised!
