**Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families**, Sara McGinnis Lee At Mass today we will pray the Our Father, saying, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done." Ask your children to think about God's will. What does that mean? Ask them whether actions speak louder than words. How?

### Reflecting on the Word:



It is easy to see ourselves as either the first or the second son in today's Gospel. Sometimes we are the first son—we initially refuse God and ignore his will for us, but through prayer and discernment, we have a change of heart. At other

times, we are the second son, and have every intention of responding to what God calls us to do but get distracted or do not follow through. How is the Lord calling us to bring our words and our actions into alignment this week?

### Living the Word:

At Home, look up Scripture verses in which Jesus speaks about the Father's will: the Agony in the Garden: Matthew 26:39, 42; Luke 22:42; the True Disciple: Matthew 7:21; Jesus and His Family: Mark 3:35. Discuss: How do we know God's will for us? How is Jesus a model for us in discerning God's will and following it, even if sometimes it is hard to? Have your children make and decorate a prayer card with the words "thy kingdom come, thy will be done" from the Our Father. Place this card somewhere you will see it as a reminder to follow God's will.

Father Marc's Minutes...

### Kenosis

Have you ever heard of that word before? The word comes from the mass and our liturgical celebration. The word kenosis means emptying or self-emptying. This is used in reference to Jesus "emptying" himself in a certain sense of his divinity to become human. We know that Jesus is one Person with two distinct natures: divine and human. He is fully God and fully man, 100% God and 100% human. There is only one agent or Person though, and that Person is the Divine Word or the Son. Person answers the question of who, and nature answers the question of what. Most of the time the ratio is 1:1, but not with Jesus. With Jesus the ratio is 1:2, one Person with two natures. In this idea of kenosis. He humbled himself and took on the nature of mankind. In the second reading, Paul speaks about this idea of kenosis in an early Christian hymn. He speaks about the humility of Christ to assume our nature and walk the path of humility during his earthly life and ministry. Jesus in his humanity did not grasp for recognition or the divine power but allowed his humanity to be shaped and molded. It was through his obedience and docility to the will of God the Father that He became exalted. Rightfully so the hymn ends with a declaration of the lordship of Jesus Christ. Saint Paul urges us to assume that same attitude and model Christ in our own lives.
