Family Talk Time:

Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families, Sara McGinnis Lee Ask your children, "How can we be prepared to receive Jesus when he comes to us?" Think about ways you prepare yourself for Mass and to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. What else can you do to prepare your hearts for Mass? What do you think Jesus meant when he talked about keeping our light burning? How can we make sure we are ready to meet him when he comes?

Reflecting on the Word:

As parents, we often prepare for a myriad of family



gatherings, taking care of arrangements and putting every detail in order. Preparation is essential, whether we are getting ready for a birthday party, a family reunion, or a wedding feast as in today's Gospel. At the time of Jesus, oil was used in clay lamps to provide light. Five of the young women bring extra oil, so that their lamps would remain lit,

while five foolish young women are unprepared and do not have the necessary oil. They find themselves in darkness, locked outside of the wedding feast. We are called to be diligent in our spiritual preparation, so we may walk in the light.

Living the Word:

Recall your children's response to the question of how we can keep our lights burning. Invite them to choose one idea to live out in the week ahead, so that you are prepared to welcome the bridegroom when he comes.

Father Marc's Minutes...

Pursue Vigilance in Wisdom



The first reading comes from the book of Wisdom. This book falls within the wisdom literature of the Old Testament. Wisdom literature deals with how to be virtuous and live a good life. In the book of

Proverbs and Wisdom there are some personifications and archetypes whose attributes are compared. Some of these include comparing the wise person to the fool, and Lady Wisdom to folly and lust. In this passage we hear a bit about wisdom. The author encourages the listener to pursue wisdom ardently and resolutely. Wisdom can be found, but it takes intentionality and persistence. When we learn a new skill or behavior it is not immediately mastered. Instead, it takes time, effort, and diligence to acquire wisdom with a new skill. Wisdom is described here as an active agent who is looking for individuals who are eager and willing to pursue her. Wisdom wants to be perceived and help shape the life of people for the better. What exactly is wisdom? In Eerdmans's Dictionary of the Bible, wisdom is defined as "the ability to make sound judgments on what we know, especially as it relates to life and conduct. The wise do not value the quantity of knowledge by itself, but the ethical and moral dimensions of how we evaluate human experience and act on it." Wisdom is not simply "book" smarts or knowing a multiplicity of facts. Rather, wisdom is the ability to make decisions and sound evaluations about human behavior. Wisdom seeks to know and understand the ethical dimensions of behavior and the world. Someone may be very intelligent, but very foolish and unwise at the same time. I pray we pursue wisdom in our everyday life on this day. Jesus is the ultimate source of prudence and wisdom.

Update on Confirmation

Some parishes have begun piloting this program. The plan is to have inperson training in the spring of next year with the hope of instituting this program next year.
