

Father Marc's Minutes...

Reconciliation discussion continued



In this article I want to break down how we are going to celebrate Reconciliation as a community on Sunday afternoon. First, we will gather with a song that discusses our call to follow Jesus. Second, we will ponder God's word and reflect on our call to personally walk with God. An aspect of being a disciple is to recognize our sins and work to correct

habits, attitudes, thoughts, and behavior so that we can more faithfully reflect the light of Jesus. We always do this work in light of the incredible generosity and mercy of God. God is the initiator and has first reached out to us. Conversion means we recognize God's first movement in our lives, and then respond to Him by committing our lives back to His care. Conversion is not about making ourselves "good enough" so that God will tolerate us. God is already deeply in love with you, and the more that realization transforms our thinking the more we will have an abundance of life. After the scripture is proclaimed, we will have an examination of conscience as a community. We prepare for important meetings in life. We prepare for our job, for interviews, and for big projects. We also prepare for our meeting God in prayer. We examine our conscience so that the crude in our life can be acknowledged and healed. The examination is not meant to make you feel shameful or falsely convict you of things that are not sins. We do this to prepare for our meeting with the Divine Physician. Next, we will acknowledge our sinfulness and together pray a litany of repentance. Following that is the time for individual confession to a priest where you will be absolved/forgiven and receive a penance. The penance is meant to be something by which we demonstrate our interior desire for conversion. When we hurt someone, we apologize. However, we oftentimes want to make it up to them. We buy flowers, gifts, or do some kind of action. That is the idea of penance. After that, we sing a song praising God for His mercy, pray the Lord's prayer and offer each other a sign of peace.

Christmas Mass Schedule

Christmas will be here sooner than we think. Christmas day falls on Monday this year. So here is the schedule for that weekend. We will have our usual 4:30pm mass on Saturday, December 23 and 9:30am Sunday December 24. Our Christmas eve mass will be 5pm on December 24 and Christmas day mass at 9:30am. We still celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent, even if it is only one day. So, you will need to go to 2 masses, one for 4th Sunday of Advent and one for Christmas. That means we need to attend either 4:30pm/9:30am and one of the 5pm/9:30am Christmas morning.
