Family Talk Time: <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u>
By Sara McGinnis Lee John said: "I am the voice of one crying in the desert, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as Isaiah the prophet said." What does it mean to be a witness? How does John the Baptist witness to the light who is to come? We are all called to testify to the light of how we live our lives and treat each other.

Reflecting on the Word:



John the Baptist's entire mission is to point others to Jesus. This is our role as parents, yes? We lead our children to Jesus in many ways-by displaying images of Jesus in our homes, by praying and saying the holy name of Jesus, and by teaching our children how to make the sign of the cross and the appropriate gestures and

responses at Mass. Sharing our faith with our children is a big and important task, and at times, we, like John, may feel unworthy of the task. Yet God has called us to point our children to Jesus! As you seek to do this, invite the Holy Spirit to guide you.

Living the Word:

In your time together, invite your family members to think of all the ways that Jesus invites us to walk as children of the light. How are we called to speak for the light? How can we testify to the light by the way we live our lives? Light a candle (either a real one of a battery operated one for safety purposes) and place it on the table where your family eats meals together as a reminder of our call bring the light of Christ to those around us.


