## FROM FR. TOM'S DESK

### The Most Holy Trinity

As Jesus prepares to go away, he promises his disciples his “forever presence” in the person of his own Spirit. When we read this pledge in the context of the entire discourse, we realize that what he promises through the Spirit goes beyond the physical presence they have experienced and anything he has already given them.

As Jesus speaks about the Spirit that he will send his disciples, the description becomes a mini-discourse on the Trinity. Jesus pledges to the disciples that the Spirit will keep them aware of who he is. Jesus, who had already proclaimed that he is the truth, now promises that the Spirit will guide them to all truth. He says that everything the Father has is his and promises that the Spirit will give them what belongs to him.

If the pronouns in that paragraph have been confusing and you are not sure who “he” is, that is because the three of them are described as one. Jesus taught that he and the Father are one, and that everything that the Father has is his. Now, he says that his work will be carried on through the Spirit, who will share with the disciples what belongs to him — and therefore to the Father. As he puts it a little later, “I in them and you in me” (John 17:23). Classic theology has described the Spirit as the living bond of love between the Father and the Son. In this Gospel, Jesus promises the Spirit as the energy or bond that will bring his disciples to share his own union with God.

### Lady Wisdom (Proverbs 8)

Wisdom is the first witness to all God does. She watches the process of creation with exquisite delight. Then, not only is she an observer, but she is so enchanted that she actually gets involved in the process with God, helping to craft creation and delighting God in all that she does. She describes her participation in creation as play, suggesting that God too was playing throughout the creative process.

As we avoid the urge to conceive of Wisdom as a member of the Trinity, we can still appreciate the idea that she, the first “other” in all of creation, was drawn into an intimate relationship with God. In that sense, she models the vocation God gave humanity from the beginning, the vocation to participate in the creation of the world, delighting in God even as God delights in humanity and all of creation. She reminds us that God created in joy for the purpose of sharing that joy.

### Importance of Faith (Romans 5)

For Paul, justification is the equivalent of what Catholics call salvation. It implies forgiveness of sin and freedom. The person who has faith is justified, meaning that she or he has accepted God's loving forgiveness. Through that process, people of faith are freed from the power of sin as well. This also means that they have been liberated from false ideas about God as a legalistic judge requiring strict compliance and the belief that death brings an end to life.

According to Paul, the newness of life that a Christian experiences in justification has come through Jesus Christ. He has revealed that God's intentions and attitude toward humanity have always been for salvation. Another way that Paul describes what salvation/justification means is by saying that “we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.” The peace to which Paul refers is multifaceted. It describes the state of harmony that exists when human beings are at one with one another and God. Peace comes from understanding what Christ has revealed: We are God's beloved, no longer servants but friends.

### The Parting Gift (John 16)

As he speaks to the disciples, Jesus describes the Spirit in ways that mirror his own life and vocation. He says that the Spirit speaks “what he hears.” In other words, like Jesus, the Spirit speaks from the heart of God, from a shared will and point of view.

Another way in which Jesus describes the union he shares with the Father and the Spirit is to say that the Spirit “will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason, I told you that [the Spirit] will take from what is mine and declare it to you.” This description of having everything in common offers a vision of the dynamic of love that constitutes the being of God. Jesus describes his union with the Father and Spirit as one of having everything in common. Obviously, because this does not refer to material possessions, it is speaking of sharing the same interior attributes such as knowledge, emotion, and will — all of which we summarize by referring to God's love.

This is vitally important, not so much for what we believe it teaches us about God in God's own self, but because Jesus promised us this Spirit. If the Spirit dwells in us, then we are invited to be guided and motivated by the very same divine knowledge, emotion, and will — in a word, by divine love.

### Called to Serve

The feast of the Trinity celebrates the graced reality that as church, we are empowered in and through the Holy Spirit to continue Jesus' mission of bringing the Father's mercy and peace to our chaotic and hurting world. As Paul so eloquently professed, “The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.”

Today, as in every Mass, we are reminded of the constancy of God's love — and our call to serve. We are not alone: The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are constant companions who illumine the path of service we embrace when we accept the trinitarian blessing at the concluding rite. Today, let that blessing serve as a poignant reminder that we, like the sometimes frightened, sometimes confident disciples of the early church, are not alone as we go out to live the call to serve.

**Family Talk Time** Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families, Sara McGinnis Lee

Who are you in relationship with daily? How does that affect your decisions?

**Reflecting on the Word:** Truth is a powerful thing that only exists in community. To be able to grasp the truth, you must hold the truth in relationship. God exists solely in relationship. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are always in relationship with one another. ## ST. GABRIEL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 9, 2019

**ATTENDANCE:** Fr. Tom Sutton, Sally Czabala, Tim Hadd, Renee Krager, Sue LeVasseur, Deb Lupo, Sandy DesJardins, Robert Milne, Marty Spencer, Jill Arndt, Janet Woronoff and Mike Jamrog

**Absent:** Karen Willsie, Keith Charbonneau and Sascha Rivet

**REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** Minutes were reviewed with one correction: Education/Formation Commission – June 7 versus June 12 will be the last day of school. Motion to approve the Minutes by Mike Jamrog and seconded by Marty Spencer.

### **NEW/OLD BUSINESS**

- Budget: Some changes were made to the proposed budget presented in April. There will be additional costs for health and dental insurance, per the Diocese; additional teacher; under building improvements, full cost of portable unit and two other projects. Motion was made to approve the updated budget effective July 1. Approval was granted by Parish Council members in attendance.
- Parish Picnic – September 8: Prizes and raffle were discussed. Deb Lupo and any other members will send Jill notes reviewing last year's picnic. A budget was requested. It was suggested that there be chairpersons – Tim Hadd and Deb Lupo volunteered. Planning will be discussed at the June meeting.
- Parish Appreciation Dinner: Last month's discussion was reviewed. Eagle Palooza is scheduled for February 8, 2020. Members were in favor of supporting the Eagle Palooza and not have both events. This topic will be revisited, if something changes.
- Council/Commission Memberships: Administration Commission has 3 vacancies; Worship Commission has 4; Christian Service has 2; Education/Formation has 2; and Parish Council has 3. Personal contact is the best approach. It was suggested that a description of each commission be published in the Bulletin.
- West Campus Floor Replacement: Mike Jamrog reported that he and Mark LeVasseur looked onsite at the product presented at the last meeting, and the reviews were far more negative than positive. They are currently looking at a product that is vinyl tile with rubber backing available in various colors and can be glued or free floating; price is the same range and installation may be done by fiscal year end.
- Staff Member: There are two applicants for the Pastoral Care Administrator position; both will interview next week.

### **COMMISSION REPORTS**

#### **Education/Formation Commission – Sandy DesJardins**

- Grandparent/Special Person Day went very well and was well attended.
- Bob Milne attended a Title II meeting; AACS will receive over \$6,000 in Title II and Title IV combined funds for next school year.
- Principal and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Teacher open positions will be posted on the Diocese website.
- May 10: School Mass followed by May Crowning
- May 20: 4-year-old graduation
- May 23: Last day for 3-year-old program
- May 31: 5<sup>th</sup> grade Mass
- June 6: Field Day
- June 7: Last day of school and Kindergarten graduation
- Anticipating 100 Preschool through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students to begin 2019-2020
- Vacation Bible School: Plans are going well
- Sacramental prep celebration went well. Blessing of sacramentals (gifts children received) will be after Mass on May 19.
- Pentecost June 8-9: An adult confirmation will be celebrated June 9
- Several baptisms are scheduled for this weekend through October

- Youth Ministry
  - Easter Egg Hunt went well
  - Debbie Wurdock of Catholic Family Services talked about mental health during the youths' last session. Covered was youth suicide, depression, and that youths have a lack of coping skills. A follow-up presentation may be scheduled in the Fall.
  - June 1: Graduation Mass
  - Offered YES (Youth Encounter Service) project – learn about poverty and reach out to poor of Saginaw. Cost is \$135; paid by parish-\$100 and \$35-parents
  - July: Loons baseball game
- Sandy is creating a Bulletin insert titled, “How Does the Holy Spirit Work in Your Life?” She sent invitations for response from Parishioners.
- Sandy is reviewing ideas for one-day sessions – possibly Dave Ramsey’s Financial University and/or Building a Strong Marriage. Talked with O’s restaurant about planning a young adult activity on a Sunday afternoon.

#### **Worship Commission – Sally Czabala**

- Discussed decorating for Pentecost
- Discussed new memberships
- Reviewed responsibilities at Picnic as Greeters
- Discussed planning for Fr. Tom’s 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination event. Will need (in shifts) kitchen help, greeters, and someone to take pictures. Help is also needed for setup on June 29. Has need to borrow glass dispensers. Final plans will be made at the June meeting.

#### **Administration Commission – Mike Jamrog**

- Water cooler in the hallway had to be replaced
- Had sewer issue at West Campus – repaired
- Sump pump at Parish Center – backup failed, as did that backup. Might have to change the line to backup pump. Fr. Tom discussed protocol with the alarm company, as there was not clear communication describing alarm and building location in call he received from representative; additionally, the representative said the pump reset itself. Ultimately, the pump did fail causing a flooded basement. Plumber and restoration company were brought in. Changing alarm companies is being considered.
- Drain for the storage unit will be taken care of after school is out.
- Roof leak at West Campus has been fixed.
- Parish Council and Planning Committee wrote another letter to Rome requesting a decision. Additionally, Bishop Hurley made an inquiry about the appeal to Rome, resulting in more information being requested. Bishop Hurley did a walk-through at West Campus. He is coordinating the next steps.
- An offer from an investor group was made regarding the Nine Mile Road property. Offer was a down payment and interest and principle for five-year period with balloon at end of fifth year. Price is \$125,000, which is more than if listed at \$150,000 with realtor. Investor group is in process of looking at drainage, zoning, etc. For property matters, the Bishop must take it to “Consulters,” which is a group of Vicars.
- Grounds cleanup is tentatively scheduled for June 1; however, weekday may be better. Following discussion with Parish Staff, date will be confirmed in Bulletin.
- Finance Reports: Overall, we are in a good financial position considering all the projects and repairs.
- CSA: Target is \$67,249; pledged to date is \$62,000 from 274 parishioners.

#### **Christian Service Commission – Renee Krager**

- April Blood Drive went very well – there were 17 donors (12 was target), which helped 51 patients. Wait was long due to computer issue and blood bank being short-staffed at our site – an additional person will be onsite next event. Next Blood Drive is June 26 at St. Gabriel from 2:00–7:00.
- Food pantry collection this weekend is for the Migrant Ministry; items needed are pinto beans, rice, corn, green beans, pancake mix and syrup, cereal, white flour, shortening, salt, pepper, and baking items. Fr. Tom stated that a donation to this program can be made from the Outreach account.
- Mother’s Day: Prayer booklet will be distributed

- Discussed memberships; there are two vacancies
- Discussed picnic responsibilities
