Family Talk Time:

Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families, Sara McGinnis Lee What does it mean to follow Jesus? Do we ever act like Peter and stand as an obstacle for others on their journey to follow Jesus?

Reflecting on the Word:

Jesus never said following him was going to be easy. He said



he is the only source of complete joy, he will give us eternal life in heaven, but he never promises that our lives would have no burdens. Jesus tells us we must "take up our cross and follow him. "Follow him where? Well, where did he go? To be crucified. But the story doesn't end on

Good Friday. We follow him all the way to Easter Sunday. Jesus promises his light will always be stronger than the darkness. But to get to that light, we must follow him.

Living the Word:

As a family, think of some people in your life who are good examples of following Jesus. Discuss how their lives have shown you how to follow Jesus, too.

We will be having a *renewal* of certification for Eucharistic Ministers and *refresher t*raining for lectors here at St. Gabriel.

As a current Eucharistic Minister this training will "renew" your certification. For Lectors it will be a refresher course. Fr. Marc will be the facilitator at these *REQUIRED* events. Please see the monthly bulletin calendar for scheduled training dates.

If you have *never* been certified by the Diocese as a Eucharistic Minister (Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion) you must attend a diocesan sponsored certification course before you can serve at St. Gabriel Parish. Self-Denial



The prophet Jeremiah has a complaint against God in the first reading. He laments how his prophetic ministry often results in rejection and being labeled as an outcast. People do not like him and mock him and the message he proclaims. So, the prophet concludes that he will no longer speak the word of the Lord. However, the call of God is irrevocable. The imagery Jeremiah uses is

very striking. He compares the fire of God's word to a fire burning in his heart. I hope each Christian has the same fire that burns constantly in their heart to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.

In the second reading Paul encourages the Romans to avoid conforming to the world and its standards. Instead of conforming to the world and minimizing God, he wants the Christians to be transformed by the renewal of your mind. When our mind is renewed then good discernment can happen. Oftentimes the battleground with temptation lies in the mind. Jesus recognized this when he said that if someone looks at another with lust, they have committed adultery in their heart. The Holy Spirit can and will bring clarity to our intentions, motivations, and thoughts. Paul also reminds us that we can offer our very selves as a living sacrifice to God. That means whatever we do, whether it be work, sports, relaxation, fellowship, mass, or prayer can be offered as a spiritual sacrifice. Sometimes this means denying ourselves a bit so we can offer a sacrifice to God for ourselves and others. Athletes deny themselves all sorts of things in their preparation for games. The spiritual life is no different. I hope we are all edified and encouraged by this reality and can see our everyday activities as acts of spiritual worship.

Training Sessions

I am offering some certification sessions for Eucharistic Ministers/Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. I want to address the reason for these sessions and hopefully clear up the confusion regarding the certification process. First, I will talk about the reasons for these certification sessions. The universal church wants to make sure that ministers understand what is going on with the practical and theological aspects of ministry. We believe the Eucharist is the source and summit of our entire faith. We also believe that the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ are truly and substantially present in the Eucharist. As such, it requires particular attention to detail and reverence.

The *first* reason for these sessions is for unity and understanding. We want to be unified in our theology and practice with the universal, diocesan, and local church. The *second*, current Eucharistic Ministers have approached me and asked for this opportunity to give thanks to God, reflect, and be renewed in our service to God. Third, it is important that we follow what is asked of us by the diocese and canon law for the worldwide church. These are the

reasons I am **requiring** your attendance at **one** of the parish certification sessions offered here at St. Gabriel. You will be certified for 3 years following these sessions. These parish formation sessions are only for those that have **previously attended** the diocesan certification program. If you have never been trained by the diocese, please look at the dates in the bulletin and attend one of those first. I welcome new people into these ministries as well. Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns.

The bulletin calendar also has dates on there for refreshing on lectoring/reading at mass. I would ask if you currently lector or are interested in serving in that ministry to please attend **one** of these sessions. We will reflect on the gift of God's Word, our calling to proclaim God's Word, and conclude with some practical aspects to consider. One final note I want to say. The Eucharistic training requirements are not new but have been in place for some time now. However, I understand this may come as a surprise. I humbly ask that we approach this with enthusiasm and optimism. It is done for love of and respect for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and in the scriptures. I have witnessed your deep love for Jesus in the mass, and I am confident that by reflecting on the gift we have received that love will continue to grow.

First Thursday

Thursday September 7th is the first Thursday of September. As a reminder, there will just be the 6:30pm mass followed by exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, private prayer time, and concluding around 8pm with night prayer. I hope you can join me for this solemn and awe-inspiring time together. In the bulletin last week, I talked about this prayer style. Going forward, the first Thursday of each month will follow this format.
